PSALM 52 — *Quid gloriaris?*

- 1 WHY BOAST-est thou thyself, thou tyrant, that thou canst do **mis**-chief :
whereas the goodness of God endur-**eth** yet dāi-ly?
- 2 Thy tongue deviseth wick-**ed**-ness : it is like a sharp razor, O thou **work**-er öf
de=ceit.
- 3 Thou hast loved evil more than **good**-ness : and to speak lies ra-**ther** than
righ-teous=ness.
- 4 Thou hast loved to speak all words that may **do** hurt : **O** thou false tongue.
- 5 Therefore shall God destroy thee for **ev**-er : he shall take thee and pluck thee
out of thy dwelling, and root thee out of the land **of** the liv-ing.
- 6 The righteous also shall see this, **and** fear : and shall **laugh** him tō scorn,
- 7 Saying, 'Lo, this is the man that took not God for **his** strength : but trusted unto
the multitude of his riches, and strengthened himself **in** his öwn wealth.'
- 8 As for me, I am like a green olive-tree in the house **of** God : my trust is in the
tender mercy of God for **ev**-er and ev-er.
- 9 I will always give thanks unto thee, because thou hast **done** it : and I will hope
in thy Name, for thy **saints** like it=well.
Glory be to the Father, and to **the** Son : and **to** the Hö-ly=Ghost;
As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever **shall** be : world with-**out** end.
